- None at this time.
- I wish more of the extra curricular activities and extras were covered by the government. Our children deserve to have this be part of their education. In the meantime, I'm happy to pay to enrich my daughter's education, but know it could put financial strain on others. I think the amount spent on staffing is very reasonable, and feel my child is well supported because of this.
- Anything that would help reduce the amount families have to pay each year would be beneficial! The majority of families are struggling to pay for groceries, the added expense of school fees can be incredibly stressful.
- can't afford it
- I'm not sure where else I can put this, so I'll put it here: The Healthy Hunger Fun Lunch program needs review. It's a great program, in theory, but some of the options are pretty sad and sometimes the costs are not appropriate. Like the McDonalds option was a hamburger with ketchup? My kids eat regular cheeseburgers. The MuchoBurrito bowl was ridiculously expensive for the amount that was provided, and even then it was too spicy for a third grader. Most recently the Boardwalk option was like full on restaurant prices (and higher) for food that will likely go to waste as they only had limited time to eat it. We opted out of this one but it would have cost us nearly fifty dollars for the stuff they would have wanted for our two kids. It might have been fun to eat but not to pay for. The funlunch program is good, and needs to be available...but it's completely out of touch.
